

**ORDINANCE NO. 07- 12**

**AN ORDINANCE OF HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY, FLORIDA TO BE KNOWN AS THE SEXUAL PREDATOR SENIOR PROTECTION ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FINDINGS RELATED TO SEXUAL PREDATORS AND STATING LEGISLATIVE INTENT; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING FOR A PROHIBITION AGAINST SEXUAL PREDATORS LIVING WITHIN ONE THOUSAND (1,000) FEET OF DESIGNATED SENIOR SAFETY ZONES; PROVIDING FOR RESTRICTIONS RELATED TO SEXUAL PREDATORS RESIDING IN NURSING HOMES AND LONG TERM CARE FACILITIES; PROVIDING FOR APPLICABILITY; PROVIDING FOR LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OPTIONS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; PROVIDING FOR SEPARATE VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR OTHER REMEDIES; PROVIDING FOR PREEMPTION AND SUNSET; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, in adopting “The Florida Sexual Predator’s Act”, the Legislature clearly articulated its concerns with the threat to society represented by sexual predators; and

**WHEREAS**, the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners is concerned about the numerous occurrences in the State of Florida and the United States, where sexual predators have been released from custody and repeat the unlawful acts for which they had originally been sentenced; and

**WHEREAS**, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement maintains and provides access to a database containing public record information on offenders classified as sexual predators under Florida law because of a conviction for a sex-related crime and/or a specified crime against children, which information is made available to interested citizens to help them educate themselves about the possible presence of such predators in their local communities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement has noted that “the theme of the 1997 National Institute of Justice (NIJ) Conference on Criminal Justice Research and Evaluation, *Crime and Place*, reflects an emerging trend among criminal justice researchers and practitioners to shift the focus of crime prevention and suppression efforts from people (potential offenders) to places”; and

**WHEREAS**, the United States Congress commissioned a study by the Government Accountability Office about Long Term Care Facilities and risks associated with resident sex offenders due to concerns about protecting the safety of nursing home residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the Colorado Bureau of Investigation has assembled the following relevant statistics:

- (1) In 2001, there were approximately 386,000 registered sex offenders in the United States.
- (2) Approximately 95% of sex offenders in the United States are under correctional supervision in the community.
- (3) At least half of convicted child molesters report that they also have sexually assaulted an adult.
- (4) Over 80% of convicted adult rapists report that they have molested children.
- (5) Approximately one-third of sex offenders report assaulting both males and females. Research shows that most convicted sex offenders have committed many, many assaults before they are caught.
- (6) Most sex offenders report that they have committed multiple types of sexual assault (sexual assault crimes include exhibitionism, voyeurism, oral sex, vaginal penetration, attempted penetration, fondling, and incest).
- (7) Over two-thirds of offenders who reported committing incest also said they assaulted victims outside the family.
- (8) Studies of victims have found that less than 16% of sex crimes are reported to law enforcement.
- (9) Most offenders commit multiple crimes against multiple types of victims with whom they have varying types of relationships (adults, children, male, female, known, and unknown). This behavior is known as "crossover".
- (10) Sex offenders rarely commit just one type of offense. Many offenders have no official prior criminal record or sex crime history of any kind.
- (11) There is no such thing as a "typical" sex offender; however, all tend to be manipulative, deceptive, and secretive. Sex offenders come from all backgrounds, ages, income levels, and professions.
- (12) Sex offenders usually do not commit their crimes impulsively. They usually carefully plan their crimes; and

**WHEREAS**, Thilman Filippini, LLC has published the following additional findings with respect to sexual predators and seniors:

- (1) Advocacy and watchdog groups say as many as 800 registered, convicted

sex offenders now reside in long-term care and assisted living facilities across the country.

- (2) States with the highest number of sex offenders *known* to be residing in nursing homes are Texas, California, Illinois, Ohio, and Florida.
- (3) Since the 1990's, resident sex offenders have committed nearly two dozen rapes, murder, and other crimes – that we know of.
- (4) One study found that of 49 registered offenders – all in their 80s and 90s – 47 were convicted of sex crimes *after* the age of 59.
- (5) Another study in 2005 found 45.2% of 756 known offenders in nursing homes were under 60. Two were 19.
- (6) Because of chronic underreporting, data limitations and privacy concerns, these statistics are just a snapshot.

**WHEREAS**, Hillsborough County is a family oriented county which highly values its senior citizens and is a place these citizens find highly desirable to reside; and

**WHEREAS**, many senior citizens have indicated there is a need to impose residency restrictions upon sexual predators as a protective measure for seniors; and

**WHEREAS**, the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners recognizes the frailties and vulnerabilities of its senior citizens and desires to ensure that they are protected from sexual predators, to the maximum extent afforded by controlling law, in order to advance the public health, safety, and welfare and benefit the citizens of the Hillsborough County; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of this ordinance is to reduce the potential risk of harm to seniors residing in Hillsborough County by limiting the frequency of contact between sexual predators and the elderly; and

**WHEREAS**, the Hillsborough County Board of County Commissioners may act in accordance with the provisions of Article II, Section 7 of the *Constitution of the State of Florida*, and the Home Rule Power of Hillsborough County, which is contained in Florida Statutes Chapter 125, which enables them to conduct county government, perform county functions, render county services, and may exercise any power for county purposes except as otherwise provided by law.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

**SECTION 1:            TITLE**

This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the “Sexual Predator Senior Protection Ordinance”.

**SECTION 2:            LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT**

(a) The findings set forth in the recitals to this Ordinance are hereby adopted as additional Legislative findings.

(b) The Board of County Commissioners of Hillsborough County, Florida, hereby finds and determines that sexual predators present an extreme threat to the public safety. Sexual predators are extremely likely to use physical violence and repeat their offenses, and most commit many offenses, have many more victims than are ever reported, and are prosecuted for only a fraction of their crimes. This makes the cost of sexual predator victimization to society at large, while incalculable, clearly exorbitant and a drain on the resources of society.

(c) It is the intent of this Ordinance to serve the County’s interest to promote, protect and improve the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Hillsborough County by creating areas around locations where senior citizens reside or regularly congregate wherein certain sexual predators are prohibited from establishing temporary or permanent residences.

**SECTION 3:            DEFINITIONS**

The following terms are defined as follows for the purposes of this Ordinance:

(a)        *Long term care facility* shall have the same meaning as “Facility” in Florida Statutes Section 400.021 as it may be amended or replaced.

(b)        *Nursing home facility* shall have the same meaning as Florida Statutes Section 400.021 as it may be amended or replaced.

(c)        *Permanent residence* means a location where a sexual predator abides, lodges, or resides and either stays or intends to stay for a period in excess of five (5) consecutive days.

(d)        *Seniors or senior citizens* means residents of Hillsborough County who have attained the age of fifty-five (55) years or older.

(e)        *Senior Safety Zone* means certain multi-dwelling areas, restricted primarily to senior citizen ownership or occupancy, which are designated by the County as senior safety zones after application to the County for Senior Safety Zone designation, and upon satisfaction of criteria established pursuant to Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners.

(f)        *Sexual Predator* shall have the same meaning as Florida Statutes Section 775.21(4), as it may be amended or replaced.

(g) *Temporary residence* A place where the person abides, lodges or resides for a period of five (5) or more days in the aggregate during any calendar year and which is not the person's permanent address, or for a person whose permanent residence is not in this state, a place where the person is employed, practices a vocation or is enrolled as a student for any period of time in this county.

**SECTION 4: PROHIBITED RESIDENCE OF SEXUAL PREDATORS**

(a) It is prohibited and unlawful for any sexual predator or person convicted of an equivalent offense in another state or jurisdiction to establish a permanent residence or a temporary residence located within Hillsborough County when such residence is located within one thousand (1,000) feet of any Senior Safety Zone.

(b) For the purposes of determining the minimum distance separation requirement, distance shall be measured by following a straight line from the outer property line of the Sexual Predator's permanent residence or temporary residence to the nearest outer property line of the designated Senior Safety Zone.

(c) The Sexual Predator does not commit a violation of this Ordinance if any of the following apply:

(1) The individual established the permanent residence or temporary residence and reported and registered the residence pursuant to Florida Statutes Sections 775.21, 943.0435, or 944.607, as applicable, prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.

(2) The individual was a minor when he/she committed the offense and was not convicted as an adult.

(3) The individual is a minor.

(4) The designated Senior Safety Zone was opened after the sexual predator established the permanent residence or temporary residence, provided the sexual predator reported and registered the residence, as required by Florida Statutes Sections 775.21, 943.0435, and 944.607.

(d) It is prohibited and unlawful for any Sexual Predator to reside temporarily or permanently in a nursing home facility or other long term care facility serving predominantly senior citizens unless the status of Sexual Predator is disclosed to the facility. Each facility housing Sexual Predators must impose stricter supervision requirements upon each Sexual Predator in residence than it does for other occupants and must also segregate the Sexual Predator from other occupants.

**SECTION 5: PROPERTY OWNERS ARE ENCOURAGED TO ASSIST LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS IN PROTECTING SENIORS**

Property owners are encouraged to collaborate and facilitate with law enforcement in the efforts of protecting seniors. Property owners should make a diligent effort to check the Florida Department of Law Enforcement's website to determine if a person has been designated a sexual predator before leasing/renting property or admitting an individual to a nursing home facility or long term care facility.

**SECTION 6: LANDLORD RESPONSIBILITIES/EXISTING CONTRACTS**

Property owners and/or managers should make a diligent effort to check the Florida Department of Law Enforcement's website to determine if a person has been designated a sexual predator before leasing/renting property or before admitting to a nursing home facility or long term care facility. The provisions of this Ordinance shall not be applied to persons residing at a prohibited residence on the effective date of this Ordinance such that it is not the intent of this Ordinance to impair valid, existing and *bona fide* contract rights; provided, however, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall apply upon termination of any leasehold relationship arising from a landlord-tenant relationship or the termination or non-renewal of a lease or the location or relocation from a facility or care center. When a person who is the subject of this Ordinance changes residence, this Ordinance shall fully apply to such person. Citizens who suspect that a sexual predator has established residency in violation of this Ordinance should contact law enforcement and report such incident.

**SECTION 7: LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OPTIONS**

Unless there has been a municipal ordinance duly enacted to the contrary, the provisions of this county ordinance shall be uniformly enforced throughout Hillsborough County by all state and local law enforcement agencies.

**SECTION 8: CONFLICTS**

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 9: PENALTIES**

The County may pursue any enforcement action or legal remedy available under controlling State law and any legal remedy available to the County to include, but not be limited to, a fine not exceeding \$500.00 or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding sixty (60) days or by both fine and imprisonment.

**SECTION 10: SEPARATE VIOLATIONS**

Each separate occurrence shall be a separate violation.

**SECTION 11:        OTHER REMEDIES**

The Board of County Commissioners of Hillsborough County may adopt such resolutions as are necessary to effectively administer this Ordinance.

**SECTION 12:        PREEMPTION AND SUNSET**

In the event any state or federal law is enacted which is more restrictive in nature as to where a sexual predator may reside or physically be located, those portions of this Ordinance where conflict with the state or federal law will cease to be in effect. In addition this Ordinance shall automatically sunset upon the effective date of any state or federal law which preempts other regulations related to the subject matter and restrictions contained in this Ordinance.

**SECTION 13:        SEVERABILITY**

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 14:        EFFECTIVE DATE**

A certified copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Florida Department of State. This Ordinance shall take effect upon the receipt of acknowledgment that the Ordinance has been filed with that office.

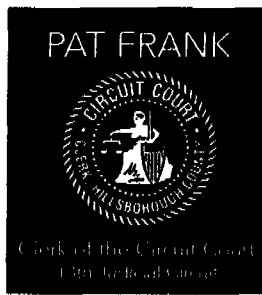


