



Hillsborough County Fire Rescue

Fact Sheet

- Coverage area: The unincorporated area encompasses **909** square miles (more than **84** percent of the total county area). Municipalities account for **163** square miles.
- Population: **832,340**
- Budget: over **\$115.6 million**
- Fire Stations: **42** (35 career, 2 Volunteer, 4 Combination, and 1 stand-alone Rescue)
- Advanced Life Support (ALS) transport units: **25**
- Approximately **32,000** medical transports in 2010 - \$9.5 million in revenue collected
- Engine (BLS)*: **5**
- Engines (ALS): **38**
- Ladder companies (ALS): **4**
- Tankers: **8**
- Hazardous Incidents Team (ALS): **1**
- Heavy Rescue (ALS): **1**
- Brush Trucks: **17**
- Urban Search and Rescue Team (FL TF-3 is cooperatively staffed by Tampa, Hillsborough County and St. Petersburg)
- Marine program (Boat 17)

- **7** Battalions staffed with **6** Battalion Chiefs, and **1** Shift Commander per shift
- **80,076** fire, emergency medical, hazardous materials, and public service calls in 2010
- Medical Emergency Response Team (MERT) supporting the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office SWAT team
- Prevention Division conducts more than 34,000 fire inspection/re-inspections annually and generates \$1.5 million in revenue
