State Road 674 Sewage Force Main

What is the project all about?

The project will construct 11,000 feet of 30-inch sewage force main along State Road 674, from U.S. Highway 301 to a lift station located just west of Upper Creek Drive. It is the first phase of a two-phase project that will eventually connect the pipeline to the county's South County Wastewater Treatment Plant on the west side of Interstate 75.

Why is the project necessary?

The new line is being built to accommodate growth in the south county area and to increase overall system reliability by providing a second transmission main along this corridor. An existing 12-inch sewage pipeline along S.R. 674 will remain in service when the new pipeline is activated.

What is the cost of the project?

\$4.8 million has been budgeted for design and construction.

What is the schedule for the project?

October 2008 - 30% design complete
January 2009 - 90% design complete
March 2009 - Final design complete
July 2009 - Construction begins and is expected to be complete within 10 months.

How is the route being chosen?

Water Resource Services is working with a private engineering firm to determine the best route for the pipeline. Factors that are being evaluated in the decision

include the location of existing and future utilities, construction costs, rights of way, impact to traffic and public facilities, and community input.

Will construction affect homes and businesses?

When the time comes, Water Resource Services will work with construction crews to ensure local residents and businesses can access their homes and buildings with minimal inconvenience.



Will additional meetings be held before construction begins?

Two more public meetings will be held. One meeting will be scheduled just before the final design is completed, and another will be held about a month before construction starts.
